

TOBB President M. Rifat Hisarcıklıoğlu:

Turkey must start focusing on the Post- Covid-19 period

entral Bank of Turkey (TCMB) entered a new path to regain its trustworthiness and prestige with a new Governor. The TCMB recently issued its Financial Stability Report, which contains remarkable evaluations about the status of the economy. The

report concludes that the global financial circumstances are in a better and more supportive position when compared to the first half of the year while also indicating that the macro-financial risks are still present because of the domestic macroeconomic

environment's reflection on inflation and current account balance, despite a fair amount of improvement recorded with the recent economic activities.

It is seen that supportive policy steps and incentives have helped limit the deterioration in macro-financial outlook. A price stability-oriented money policy and other policies that will be realized in coordination with respective shareholders in the upcoming period may help further limit the risks on macro-financial stability.

To sum up, the current main goal is to ensure a new and correct path for economy. The current wish is to leave behind the old path, which has proven ineffective and unsuccessful, and find a brand new and more successful path. After all, what really matters in economic policy design is not "not making mistakes", but to determine the mistake as soon as possible and form a new path based on the goal. Turkey must start focusing on recovery dynamics in the post- Covid-19 period.

Representatives of the Turkish Business world met their colleagues in Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan which continues their fight against attacks and attempts of invasion by Armenia.




